

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Regenerative Farmer Assurance Fund

Healing Soils Foundation launched this fund to provide critical financial relief to organic and regenerative farmers facing delays in public funding. Farmers in Midwest states (Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin) who have executed contracts for programs like EQIP, CSP, and RFSI and are experiencing public funding delays causing immediate financial needs can apply for grants up to \$50,000 per farmer.

Applications are rolling with funds distributed as available.

Maryland Food and Agricultural Resiliency Mechanism Grant Program

Grants from \$5,000 to \$40,000 allow Maryland's food banks, charitable emergency food providers, and nonprofits to request funding to purchase agricultural/seafood products listed in the Certified Local Farm and Fish Program.

Applications are due by May 2, 2025.

Minnesota Meat Processing Train and Retain Grant

This program awards one-time funding to partner organizations that will work with small- to medium-sized

meat and poultry processors in hiring and training new employees. Grants from \$10,000 to \$250,000 support the development of incentive projects like tuition reimbursements, sign-on and retention bonuses, and childcare stipends.

Applications are due by April 28, 2025.

• Farmers Invited to Share Stories of Funding Freeze Impacts

Several organizations and entities are <u>inviting farmers to share stories</u> of how the federal funding freeze has affected them. The House Ag Committee is seeking stories from farmers on real-world impacts to their work related to program and personnel loss. In addition, Farm Aid has a survey for farmers and organizations impacted by the funding freeze. Farm Aid will use the responses for its advocacy work. Meanwhile, National Farmers Union is also collecting stories from farmers and organizations that it will use for advocacy work.

• Understanding Ag Offers Adaptive Grazing Tips

Dr. Allen Williams shared <u>adaptive grazing tips</u> to kick off the 2025 grazing season in a post on the Understanding Ag website. Williams offers a wide-ranging list of considerations, addressing disruption, rest and recovery, epigenetic selection, and monitoring, as well as discussing specific strategies like bale grazing and stockpile grazing.

• 'Cattle Voltaics' Combine Grazing and Solar Panels

A Colorado-based cattle operation is demonstrating the <u>feasibility of "cattle voltaics,"</u> according to a blog from the Center for Rural Affairs. Huwa Enterprises conducted a successful test in 2023 with 100 yearling cattle grazing among solar panels. Since then, the company has completed three successful utility-scale solar grazing projects and is now helping other solar projects integrate livestock. *Related NCAT publication:* <u>Best Practices in Agrisolar</u>

• Appalachian Farms Feeding Families Supports Hurricane Recovery

Appalachian Sustainable Agriculture Project re-established its <u>Appalachian Farms Feeding Families</u> program as part of its response to Hurricane Helene. The program gets fresh, locally grown food to people impacted by the storm, while at the same time providing cash flow for farms that are in the process of rebuilding or have lost market outlets. The program currently is focusing on providing local food to Early Childhood Education sites and restaurants.

• New Hampshire Food and Agriculture Strategic Plan Released

New Hampshire Food Alliance, in partnership with the New Hampshire Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food; UNH Extension; and more than 89 other food system organizations and hundreds of individuals deeply committed to New Hampshire's food system, released the New Hampshire Food and Agriculture Strategic Plan. The plan proposes more than 140 recommendations that address 27 agriculture and food-related topics through product, market, and issue briefs.
